People Experiencing Housing Insecurity

Objective Housing Insecurity



Out of **428** survey submissions, **32** respondents were found to be housing secure, and **396** were found to be housing insecure.

An additional **737** individuals (dependents and adults) shared housing conditions with housing insecure respondents.

Reasons for Insecurity

- Don't make enough money
- Can't afford rent/mortgage
- Mental health issues



Shelter Use Barriers

- No shelters in area
- Did not feel safe
- Separation from partner/spouse

- Basic Needs
- Financial
- Health and Wellness

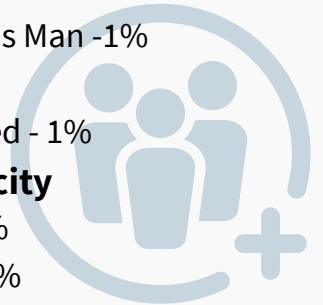
Reasons for Community Residency

Gender Identity

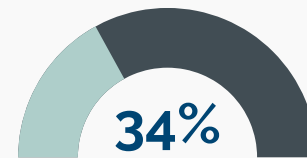
- Female/ Woman - 62%

Ethnicity

- Caucasian - 77%
- Indigenous - 13%
- Asian - 2%
- Hispanic/Latino - 1%
- African - 1%
- Identity not listed - 5%

Employment Status and Type



Only **34%** of housing insecure respondents are employed.

57% are full-time, **28%** are part-time, and **10%** working casual.
