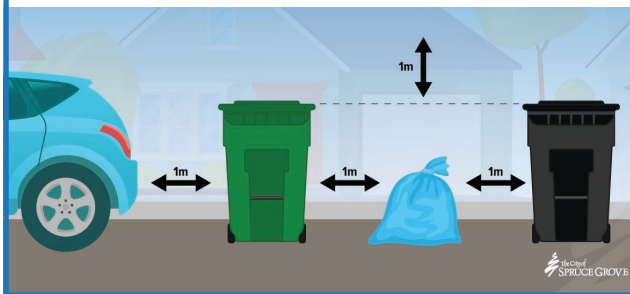


Learn about waste collection requirements and new cart storage guidelines

When putting your black waste cart and green organics cart out for collection, please remember to keep these guidelines in mind to help ensure efficient pickup:

- Carts must be set out for collection by 7 a.m. on your collection day, but no earlier than 24 hours in advance of your collection day.
- Remember to space your waste. Ensure there is at least one meter's length of clearance on all sides of the carts.
- New! When it's not collection day, all your carts must be stored on your personal property. That means no carts on the road, sidewalk, or alley.

Monthly organics collection December 11-15

Green organics carts will be collected from December 11-15 on your regular waste collection day. In the winter, green organics carts are collected during the second full week of the month. Use the City's waste sorting app to subscribe for waste collection reminders and learn how you can reduce your food waste. Council approves 2024-2026 Corporate Plan

Spruce Grove City Council has approved the 2024-2026 Corporate Plan and 2024 budget which includes an operating budget of \$85.9 million and a capital budget of \$46.36 million. Council also approved a municipal tax revenue increase of \$3.03 million consisting of \$1.57 million for municipal services, \$0.96 million for asset lifecycle costs, and \$0.50 million for investment in the Civic Centre.
